**MEDICAL WASTE TRANSPORTER/HAULER
ANNUAL VERIFICATION AND CONDITIONS**

November 24, 2025

The California Department of Public Health, Medical Waste Management Program (Department), has confirmed your company is currently registered as a hazardous waste transporter with the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC). The Department has also verified that your company is using a medical waste tracking document per CA Health and Safety Code (HSC) Section 118040. You are required to maintain your registration as a hazardous waste transporter and to abide by the conditions outlined on the enclosed pages per HSC Sections 118000 – 118040. Transporters of medical waste who maintain their annual hazardous waste transporter registration with DTSC and submit medical waste hauling reports quarterly to the Department will be added to the list of current medical waste transporters provided on our website.



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Haulers of medical waste in California shall meet all United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) requirements for transporting medical waste, shall be registered as hazardous waste transporters [per the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC)] in California and must operate in compliance with the Medical Waste Management Act [California Health and Safety Code (HSC) Sections 117600-118360] and the following conditions:

- 1) A copy of the transporter's valid (DTSC) hazardous waste transporter registration certificate shall be kept in the transporter's possession while hauling medical waste. [HSC Section 25163(a)(2)].
- 2) Medical waste shall only be transported to a permitted medical waste treatment facility or to a transfer station or another registered generator for the purpose of consolidation before treatment and disposal. [HSC Section 118000(a)].
- 3) USDOT-approved containers of medical waste shall be labeled according to HSC Section 118275 (b), containerized per HSC Section 118280 (a) and (c) and lined with a biohazard bag that is both ASTM D1709 and ASTM D1922 certified per HSC Section 117630.
- 4) After pickup from a generator, medical waste shall only be transported to a permitted treatment facility or transfer station. **No Offsite Storage of medical waste is authorized except on the premises of a permitted transfer station or treatment facility.** [HSC Sections 118000(a) and 118035]
- 5) Medical waste transported out of state shall be consigned to a permitted medical waste treatment facility in the receiving state.

Tracking Documents [HSC Section 118040 (a)-(e)]:

- 6) A hazardous waste transporter or generator who transports medical waste to a facility shall maintain a completed tracking document in compliance with subdivision (b) for the purpose of tracking the medical waste from the point when the waste leaves the generator facility until it receives final treatment. At the time the medical waste is received by a hazardous waste transporter, the transporter shall provide the generator with a copy of the tracking documents for the generator's records per HSC Sections 117943 and 117975. The transporter shall maintain its copy of the tracking documents for three (3) years.
- 7) Tracking Document Requirements:
 - a. The tracking document shall include, but not be limited to, all of the following information as specified in Section 118040(b):

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- (1) The name, address, telephone number, and registration number of the transporter, unless transported pursuant to Section 117946 or 117976.
 - (2) The type of medical waste transported and the quantity or aggregate weight of medical waste transported.
 - (3) The name, address, and telephone number of the generator.
 - (4) The name, address, telephone number, permit number, and the signature of an authorized representative of the permitted facility receiving the medical waste.
 - (5) The date that the medical waste is collected or removed from the generator's facility, the date that the medical waste is received by the transfer station, the registered large quantity generator, or point of consolidation, if applicable, and the date that the medical waste is received by the treatment facility
- b. Tracking documents shall be kept in the possession of transporters/drivers while transporting medical waste. The tracking document shall be shown upon demand to any enforcement agency personnel or officer of the Department of the California Highway Patrol.
 - c. Copies of tracking documents shall be maintained for all completed shipments of medical waste for a period of three (3) years [HSC 118040(a)]. Records must be made available for review by Program staff.
 - d. The transporter shall provide the facility receiving the medical waste with the original tracking documents.

Information Requirements [HSC Section 118029]:

- 8) A copy of the current *hazardous waste transporter registration* certificate (via DTSC Form 187) shall be filed with the Department along with an updated verification form (CDPH Form 8668) annually. Also include the most current tracking documents and a current contract with a permitted treatment facility or transfer station. Per HSC Section 118029(a), on or before July 1 of each year, a registered hazardous waste hauler that transports medical waste shall so notify the department the following information:
 - (1) Business name, address, and telephone number.
 - (2) Name of owner, operator, and contact person.

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- (3) Hazardous waste transporter registration number.
 - (4) The number of vehicles and trailers transporting medical waste within the state as of that date.
 - (5) Types and quantities of medical waste collected, in pounds.
 - (6) The names of the generators whose waste has been transported by the hauler and the amounts of medical waste transported, by waste type category.
- 9) Each registered hazardous waste hauler shall provide to the Department a QUARTERLY REPORT (list) of all medical waste generators serviced during the previous 12 months. That list shall include the business name, business address, mailing address, telephone number, and contact name of the generators (includes trauma scene waste companies and generators while contracted with another hauler) and the waste types and quantities collected, in pounds.
- 10) The quarterly report shall be provided to the Department within 10 days of the close of the earliest calendar quarter ending September 30, December 31, March 31, or June 30, or as otherwise required by the department. This information may be sent according to the DATA SUBMISSION PROTOCOL form [CDPH 8666] **(preferred: Microsoft Excel Spreadsheet, by e-mail)**. The report shall include the name, address, DTSC registration number of the hauler and the quarter/year of the list at the top of the report.
